319 Grant – \$326,000 to aid in the construction of three underground stormwater infiltration vaults that will store 25 acre-feet of stormwater runoff. The grant money will be utilized to purchase and install an OptiNimbus system that will optimize the stormwater volume reduction in an underground infiltration vault through cloud based adaptive controls

RIA Grant- \$500,000 to aid in the construction of three underground stormwater infiltration vaults that will store 25 acre-feet of stormwater runoff. Will be utilized in the construction of these BMPs to reduce the erosion and flooding

SRF Loan – \$5M to aid in the construction of three underground stormwater infiltration vaults that will store 25 acre-feet of stormwater runoff. Will be utilized in the construction of these BMPs to reduce the erosion and flooding of the Sand River

HMGP Grant – \$10M to aid in the construction of three underground stormwater infiltration vaults that will store 25 acre-feet of stormwater runoff and retrofitting an existing park with green infrastructure and passive stormwater detention to provide 6.55 acre-feet of storage volume. Would be utilized in the construction of these stormwater volume reduction BMPs to reduce the erosion and flooding of the Sand River

NEW JERSEY GRANTS

The NJ DOT Local Aid Resource Center is a new statewide effort designed to serve the needs of the 21 counties and 565 local governments throughout the state.
